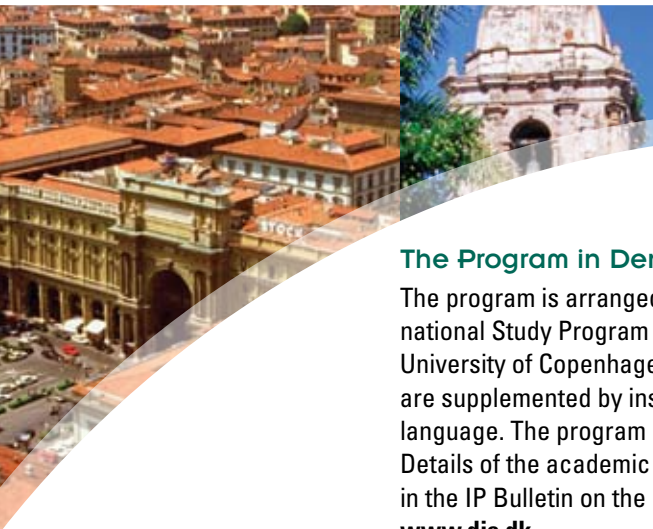

The Program in Denmark

The program is arranged by Denmark's International Study Program (DIS), an affiliate of the University of Copenhagen. Architecture courses are supplemented by instruction in the Danish language. The program includes study tours. Details of the academic program are provided in the IP Bulletin on the IP website. Also see: www.dis.dk.

The Program in Germany

Students with advanced German language proficiency can enroll in architecture courses for the entire academic year at the University of Stuttgart. Students less proficient in the language concentrate their studies on German language during the fall semester at the University of Tübingen and then, provided that they have made sufficient progress, enroll in architecture courses in Stuttgart for the spring semester.

The Program in Italy

Architecture courses are supplemented by mandatory Italian language instruction and electives. Three levels of Italian language are offered each term. All students also take Italian Conversation during the fall semester. Details of the academic program are provided in the IP Bulletin on the IP website.

The Program in Mexico

Students with proficiency in Spanish may enroll in architecture courses for the entire academic year. Students less proficient in Spanish enroll in Spanish language classes during the fall semester and then, provided that they have made sufficient progress, take architecture courses during the spring semester.

BENEFITS

- Students earn regular CSU resident credit for all coursework abroad.
- International Programs is supported by the state of California. Student fees cover a portion of the cost.
- International Programs assists in international arrangements including academic planning, transportation, visas, housing and other matters.
- Once abroad, students receive assistance from CSU resident staff and/or host institution staff.

COSTS

IP is the most affordable study abroad program available to CSU students. The estimated cost for study abroad includes State University Fee, round-trip transportation, room and board, personal expenses, and group activities.

ELIGIBILITY

- Enrollment in fourth or final year of architectural studies at Cal Poly Pomona or Cal Poly San Luis Obispo by the end of spring term 2010.
- A cumulative GPA of 2.75 for all college-level work by the application deadline.
- Favorable recommendation by the architecture faculty at your home campus.

How to Apply

Your Campus Coordinator (see below) will provide you with additional information about the online application. Complete your application by February 1. You will be interviewed on campus, and the committee's recommendation will be forwarded to the central Office of International Programs. A statewide committee makes final recommendations, and you will be notified of the results in early April.

Housing

DENMARK: DIS arranges housing for IP students. Students may live with Danish host families, in the Danish "Kollegium", in student resident halls, or in shared apartments.

GERMANY: IP is able to arrange housing for participants in university dormitories or in rented rooms. Reasonably priced meals are available in student restaurants. Students with spouses or accompanying children will require extra consultation.

ITALY: Students are housed in hotel accommodations for a period of 7 days while they arrange their permanent housing for the year using

agencies and information provided by the housing counselor in Florence. Most students take apartments within walking distance of the CSU Study Center.

MEXICO: The Tec makes arrangements for all students to live with host families for 15 days upon arrival. Students may continue living with their host families or locate other housing on their own.

International Programs

International Programs is the systemwide study abroad program of the CSU. It is affiliated with over 50 distinguished universities and other institutions of higher education in 19 countries where you can pursue coursework for CSU resident credit. Currently in its 47th year of continuous operation, the academic excellence of International Programs has been recognized by respected organizations such as the Council of Learning and the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. It provides international academic opportunities in the framework of a California State University degree program.
