Admission Application Fee Waiver Procedure

The California State University has established policies and procedures to respond to the needs of California residents for whom payment of the admission application fee may constitute extreme undue financial hardship. In addition to being a California resident, an applicant must be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, or otherwise eligible as a lawful immigrant in order to receive the benefit of a fee waiver. Applicants or their parents, if appropriate, must provide limited financial information on the "Request to Waive Admission Application Fee" form for the campus to determine that the fee would represent an undue financial hardship. The income criteria used to determine eligibility for the fee waiver are based on national standards for purposes of determining eligibility for student financial aid programs or for other public benefits.

The income criteria used to determine eligibility for single independent applicants and independent applicants without dependents other than a spouse represent the 2011 poverty guidelines established by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. For dependent applicants and independent applicants with dependents other than a spouse, the criteria represent the approximate income at which no contribution would be expected from the parents or the independent student based on the federal need analysis methodology for student financial aid programs for 2012-2013.

When an admission application is received without the required fee, the application is retained by the office of admission and a request for payment is sent to the applicant along with the "Request to Waive Admission Application Fee" form. If the request for fee waiver is denied, the campus will notify the applicant that he or she has up to 30 days to pay the required fee for the admission application to be processed. Applicants applying for admission through CSUMentor are provided an opportunity to apply electronically for a fee waiver with immediate analysis of their eligibility.

All campuses permit applicants to retain the initial filing date as priority date for admission consideration. However, applicants are required to submit application fees or approved fee waiver appeals within campus-specific time periods to maintain the initial application filing date as the priority date.

All students are strongly encouraged to apply electronically via CSUMentor at www.csumentor.edu. CSU Mentor has the capability to provide fee waivers online, i.e. without the submission of a paper "Request to Waive Admission Application Fee" form.

Statement of Intent to Register (SIR) and Deposits

As part of a comprehensive plan to enhance enrollment management, many CSU campuses have instituted enrollment confirmation procedures. A few campuses also require monetary deposits. Applicants who have been accepted are expected to notify the campus of their “**Statement of Intent to Register**” (SIR) and make required enrollment deposits by a date specified by the campus. Enrollment confirmation deposits are applied as payment against the tuition fee payable at the time of registration for students who matriculate. An enrollment confirmation deposit is forfeited for a student who does not enroll. Students eligible to receive financial aid and/or fee waivers will not be required to pay the enrollment deposit.

Transcript Requirements for First-time Freshman Applicants

Documents Required to Make Initial Admission Decision. Several CSU campuses make preliminary offers of admission to first-time freshman applicants whose grade point averages (GPAs) based on “a-g” college preparatory courses are 3.00 and above on the basis of information provided on the application for admission. For applicants with GPAs lower than 3.00, test scores are required. Applicants for whom admission decisions cannot be made on the basis of information submitted for initial admission processing will be notified of additional information requirements by the campus. Thorough and accurate completion of the application will expedite initial admission processing. Academic performance information provided on the application and final CSU admission eligibility are verified following receipt of the official high school transcript showing date of graduation.

***SSU: Impacted majors that require supplemental admissions criteria such as, a questionnaire and or essay, and or verification of grades in specific courses will require that the necessary documentation to be submitted prior to an offer of admission being made. Therefore an admission decision for an applicant to an impacted major will take longer to receive than a decision for an applicant to a non-impacted major.*

All Campuses Require Final High School Transcript Showing Date of Graduation.

In the absence of final high school transcripts, which indicate the date of graduation, offers of admission, schedules of classes, financial aid awards, and/or housing contracts may be subject to cancellation.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION RELATING TO THE NEW SB 1440 TRANSFER ASSOCIATE DEGREES (AA-T & AS-T)

The Student Transfer Achievement Reform (STAR) Act (SB 1440) establishes an Associate in Arts (AA-T) or Associate in Science (AS-T) for transfer for California Community College student and is designed to provide a clear pathway to the CSU degree major. The Student Transfer Achievement Reform Act commences with the 2011-12 academic year (AY).

California Community College students who earn a transfer associate (AA-T or AS-T) degree are guaranteed admission with junior standing to the CSU and given priority admission over other transfer students when applying to a local campus, or non-impacted program. AA-T or AS-T admission applicants are given priority consideration to impacted campus and/or program that has been deemed similar to the degree completed at the community college.

Statement of Intent to Register (SIR) & Deposits (page 2)	Each CSU campus may create a Statement of Intent to Register (SIR) & Deposit process specifically for transfer associate degree applicants admitted to a similar degree program. Those processes for the AY 2012-2013 will be posted on the individual campus websites.
New Student Orientation – Attendance and Fees: Transfer (AY2012-13) (page 3)	AA-T or AS-T transfer students admitted to a similar degree program may be mandated by their CSU campus to attend specified orientation or advisement sessions. Those policies for the AY 2012-2013 will be posted on the individual campus websites.
Transfer Admission & Registration Prior to Receipt of All Official Transcripts (page 7-8)	Policies specific to transfer associate degree students applying to a similar degree program will be posted on the individual campuses admission websites.
Transfer Certification and Double Counting for Major Requirements (page 9)	Submission of the final official CCC transcript with the degree posted is accepted as meeting all of the lower division general education requirements as well as other lower division major requirements.
Grades in Repeated Courses Taken from Different Colleges for Transfer (page 10-11)	Each CSU campus will review all baccalaureate courses and grades that students complete before transferring. While students who complete AA-T or AS-T will fulfill all lower division requirements, their transfer grade point averages may be adjusted if all prior work was not originally considered. These adjustments may result from unconsidered work, repeated courses, the exclusion of non-baccalaureate credits, and from work originally reported as in-progress.
Communication in the English Language and Quantitative Reasoning Completion Dates for Upper Division Transfer Students (page 12)	AA-T & AS-T transfer applicants are held to the upper division transfer completion timelines described on page 10.
High Unit Majors with Authorized Exceptions to Admission and General Education – Breadth Requirements (page 13)	There are no AA-T or AS –T high unit transfer degrees at this time.
Registration Priorities for Upper Division Transfers (page 14)	CSU campuses may create specific registration processes that may include required advisement sessions prior to registration for associate degree transfer students admitted to a similar degree program. Those policies will be posted on the individual campus websites. Students applying to a program that is not similar to their AA-T or AS-T degree are considered upper division transfer and therefore are held to the policies described on page 9.
Transfer Credit Summary (page 15)	While students who complete the AA-T or AS-T degrees will fulfill all lower division requirements, they will most likely be provided with a summary of transfer credit that may also include the remaining requirements for the baccalaureate degree in a similar major. Because of the uniqueness of the transfer associate degrees, many campuses may have specific deadlines for the submission of official final transcripts required for admission decisions and the creation of individual academic degree plans.

(For example, Fall Quarter applicants must complete these items by the end of the Spring term.)
Fresno	Will admit provisionally based on work-in-progress. Registration hold is placed for official transcript(s) until received.
Fullerton	May admit provisionally but will withhold registration until <i>all</i> official transcripts are received. Students must have completed 60 or more transferable semester units. Courses in GE areas A and B4 must be completed (with grades of "C" or higher) by the end of spring for fall admission and by the end of summer term for spring admission.
Humboldt	Will auto-admit based on self-reported courses. Cannot attend orientation or register for classes until all transcripts received.
Long Beach	Official transcripts are required prior to admission. Provisional admission will be granted based on work-in progress. All CSU and impacted major admission requirements must be completed by the end of the prior Spring semester for Fall admission consideration and by the end of Summer for Spring admission consideration. Final transcript(s) must be received by established deadlines.
Los Angeles	Final official transcripts for all provisionally admitted students must be received by the posted deadline. Students must have completed 60 or more transferable semester units and GE areas A-B4 by end of Spring. No Summer coursework will be considered for Fall admission.
Maritime Academy	Will admit conditionally based on official Fall semester transcript and Spring semester work-in-progress. Registration hold is placed for official Spring semester transcript(s) until received. No Summer semester work for Fall admission

Must submit an official in progress transcript by Feb. 15 in order to verify conditional admission eligibility. No summer coursework is accepted for fall selection. Northridge	Admission granted with partial transcripts and/or evidence of work-in-progress. Official transcripts that include work-in-progress are required by February 15 and final official transcripts are required by July 15 to verify eligibility for fall admission. The campus reserves the right to cancel an applicant's admission for failure to submit timely transcripts verifying admission eligibility.
San Diego	Will issue conditional admission prior to receipt of transcripts. Final official transcripts and test scores are required for registration. The campus reserves the right to cancel an applicant's admission for failure to submit timely transcripts verifying admission eligibility.
San Francisco	Will issue conditional admission prior to receipt of transcripts. Official transcripts showing satisfactory completion of areas A and B4, 60 transferable semester units with minimum GPA must be received by mid July or student will be disenrolled. No summer coursework will be considered for fall admission purposes.
San José	Will provisionally admit on SR information; however, will hold registration until transcripts arrive confirming SR information and all four basic skills are completed. Final official transcripts must be received by July 15 for fall. The campus reserves the right to cancel an applicant's admission for failure to submit documents on or before July 15. No summer course work is accepted for fall admission.
San Luis Obispo	Will issue conditional admission prior to receipt of final transcripts. Transfer applicants must have final official transcripts submitted by the July 15 th deadline for fall admissions. Additionally, transfer applicants are advised to complete GE areas A and B4 prior to filing an application for admission in addition to other recommended coursework as listed on the Cal Poly San Luis Obispo Admissions web site: http://admissions.calpoly.edu/apply/transfer_sc . No summer course work is accepted for fall selection.
San Marcos	To complete the application processes, official transcripts must be received by CSU San Marcos from each college or university the applicant has attended. Evaluation of applications and notification of decisions will occur on a rolling basis. Applicants are encouraged to submit transcripts as soon as they apply but no later than February 1, 2012 for priority consideration. It is the applicant's responsibility to request transcripts from all institutions previously attended as well as official CLEP, AP or IB scores or military transcripts. Provisional admission may be granted on work-in-progress. Final transcripts must be received by July 15, 2012. The campus reserves the right to cancel an applicant's admission for failure to submit timely transcripts verifying admission eligibility.
Sonoma	All transcripts must be official for an admission decision determination. Will admit with final semester still outstanding. The campus reserves the right to cancel an applicant's admission for failure to submit documents/transcripts on or before deadlines. No summer course work is accepted for fall admission.
Stanislaus	Transfer students admitted conditionally prior to receipt of official transcripts. Final official transcripts and test scores are required for registration. The campus reserves the right to cancel an applicant's admission for failure to submit timely transcripts verifying admission eligibility.

Transfer Certification and Double Counting for Major Requirements

CSU Executive Order (EO) No. 1033, "General Education-Breadth Requirements," includes the following, "Campuses may permit 'double counting' of courses for General Education-Breadth and major requirements and prerequisites only after giving careful consideration to the impact of such actions on General Education-Breadth programs. Decisions to permit double counting in General Education-Breadth and a degree major may be made only after an approval is provided through specific campus curricular processes."

Please note that all CSU campuses allow transfer applicants who submit full or area certifications to double count courses for general education and major requirements. Exceptions are indicated below:

Campus	Comment
Bakersfield	Courses can be double counted if articulated.
Channel Islands	Some double counting is permitted.
Chico	Some double counting is permitted; subject to department approval.
Dominguez Hills	Double counting is permitted in certain majors.
East Bay	No course in the major department can be applied to GE. However, courses required for the major but offered by another department can be applied to GE.
Fresno	Double counting is subject to departmental approval. A maximum of two courses may be double counted for most majors.
Fullerton	Double counting is permitted, except those credits (units) applying to business and communication.
Humboldt	Yes, will certify GE areas and double count major/GE
Long Beach	Campus allows a total of 10 units in major and GE to overlap for students not fully certified.
Los Angeles	Courses can be double counted if articulated.
Maritime Academy	Required courses in some degree programs may also fulfill certain GE categories

Students are encouraged to attend orientation sessions when offered. Attendance at orientation is often mandatory to ensure early registration. The Chico, Fresno, Humboldt, Long Beach, Los Angeles, Monterey Bay, Pomona, San Marcos, and Stanislaus campuses include priority registration as part of their orientation programs.
