

Major and Career Indecision

What percentage of students change their major at least once?

What percentage of students go into college undecided?

75% of students change their major at least once (Gordon & Steele, 2015)

20% - 50% of students enter college undeclared (Gordon, 1995)

77.1% of first-generation students seek guidance from parents/step-parent/guardian


