Dual Enrollment option 1. Educational Goal

- Allows high school students to apply to a CSU to enroll in college courses and earn college credit (dual enrollment)
- Based on campus availability
- Does NOT constitute or replace an admissions application





Dual Enrollment (I am a current high school student who is interested in taking college-level courses at a CSU campus before high school graduation)

FAQ: What if a student wants to take dual enrollment courses at the CSU their senior year but also wants to apply as a freshman for the upcoming year?

ANSWER:


For this year – the student will need to apply directly to the CSU for dual enrollment courses using their existing internal application process.

The admissions application will always take precedence. The applicant would use Cal State Apply to submit their freshman application.

In future cycles, the applicant will be able to use Cal State Apply for both.


ANSWER:

If a high school offers courses that have various term types, or has converted term types during attendance, enter the high school twice with the different term types each time.

Be sure the applicant reports the correct courses under the correct term type!




ANSWER:

Students applying to the CSU should indicate the specific language in the "High School Coursework" section of the application for admission.

EX: Spanish Proficiency

Students should indicate completion of two years of one language with a grade of "Pass" on consecutive rows.

FAQ: What if the dual enrollment coursework displays both on the HS transcript and college transcript?

ANSWER:

Regardless of where the coursework displays, it is still college credit earned through dual enrollment and should be reported in the College Coursework section.



FAQ: What if a college course is designated by the college as worth two years of credit, but the application only awards one year?

EXAMPLE:

Student takes a Language other than English course that is designated in the college's course catalog as worth 2 years of credit

ANSWER:

Enter the college course and passing grade of C or better.

Enter the same course in the College Coursework section and enter the grade as Pass and REMOVE CREDITS.

Manually map both courses to the appropriate A-G area to give the candidate two years of credit.

FAQ: What if my student is meeting subject area B English requirements through dual enrollment?

enrollment (A2) but no other HS English courses, and they are only given one full year of credit



Enter the college course and passing grade of C- or better.

Manually map all 4 courses to area B English to give the candidate four years of credit.

What is Validation?

There are two kinds of validation:

- Validation of coursework is when a lower-level course is granted credit ("validated") even if the lower-level course was not actually completed. This is called "subject omission."
- Validation of a D or F grade (called a "grade deficiency") in a lower-level course after completing a higher-level course with a grade of C or better

CSU Validation applies to:

- Math
- Language Other than English (LOTE)
- Chemistry


Course validation happens automatically for California high schools that use the UC A-G course list.

For course validation to occur within the application, the courses must be populated using the prefill

Validation only applies to meeting subject requirements. Failed courses are still counted in the GPA calculation unless repeated.


Course Validation for Grade Deficiencies

A grade of C or higher in the second semester validates a D or F earned in the first semester.




Course Validation for Subject Omission

A C- or better in the first semester of a higher-level course validates a lower-level course

LOTE



*A second semester of Algebra 2 validates the deficient first term AND Algebra 1. Spanish 2 validates the deficient first term AND Spanish 1.


A grade of C- or better in the second term of Geometry will validate the first term



A grade of C- or better in the first term of Algebra II validates both terms of Algebra I



Through Summer 2025- Statistics will validate Algebra I and Algebra II, but will not validate Geometry



Advanced Mathematics validates the entire sequence.





Notes on Repeated Courses

Current Policy:

Required A-G courses must be completed with a grade of C- or better. Any course may be repeated as long as the course curriculum is the same or similar to the original course. Course titles should be exactly the same or similarly named course titles. There is no limitation on the number of times a course can be repeated.

Cal State Apply High School Coursework:

- If a high school course **has been repeated**, only the **higher grade** needs to be self-reported.
- If the applicant is currently repeating a course or plans to repeat a course, the original grade must be reported. Report the in-progress course or when the course repetition is planned.
- Highest grade is calculated in GPA (excluding 9th grade)

FAQ: What about courses completed through EdGenuity, BYU Online, Silicon Valley, etc?

ANSWER:

So long as the course content is the same or very similar and the name of the course matches the failed course, the repeated course is acceptable.

Ex:

- English 9
- English 9 EdGenuity

OR

- English 9
- English 1

NOTE: If a course is notated on your transcript with an "R" for repeat, then the CSUs are going to accept that course as a repeat

Applicants who have 0 years for Area G and another subject area (A-F) that exceeds the minimum required will automatically have Area G fulfilled by reassigning a course from A-F.

- Courses will be reassigned to area G using a hierarchy of subjects (see image below)
- Reassigning courses only applies to courses from CMP or imported from CCGI.
- If the applicant exceeds the minimum with subject validation (in C Mathematics or E LOTE), a course wouldn't be reassigned to Area G.






Mixed Educational Records
