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RE: Student Housing – Annual Report

California Education Code 66014.6 stipulates that each California State University (CSU) campus that provides campus-owned, campus-operated, or campus-affiliated student housing is required to post on its website, at least twice each academic year, all of the following information:

(1) The number of enrolled students.

(2) Existing campus housing stock, including, but not limited to, the number of available beds on campus.

(3) The number of students on the campus housing waiting list, and how many students have removed themselves from the waiting list since the last report.

(4) *If available*, the number of students who request campus-owned, campus-operated, or campus-affiliated student housing.

(5) *If available*, the number of incoming freshmen, transfer students, and international students requiring campus-owned, campus-operated, or campus-affiliated student housing.

The table below shows Fall 2024 CSU enrollment and housing data to fulfill the annual reporting requirement. The data will be posted on CSU campuses' websites and accessible by the public, including CSU students and parents.

Please note:

(a) The report does not account for students who choose to live outside of university housing facilities.

(b) Existing campus housing inventory (beds) reflects housing capacity adjusted for increase or decrease in permanent conversions and temporary adjustments and may include newly acquired or constructed housing facilities.

(c) Waitlists vary from campus to campus based on inventory and demand. Campuses that can accommodate all eligible students who apply for housing may choose not to have a waitlist.

(d) The number of students who request campus-owned, campus-operated, or campusaffiliated student housing represents the number of housing applicants.

(e) The number of incoming freshmen, transfer students, and international students requiring student housing includes students who are required to live on campus pursuant to live-on requirements, if the data is available.
