



CSUPERB Announces 18 Travel Grant Awards to CSU Students and Faculty at 11 Campuses

CSUPERB is pleased to announce the fall 2022 round of travel grant awards. Overall CSUPERB is making 18 awards totaling \$27,000 to CSU faculty and students at 11 CSU campuses.

Student Travel Grant Awards

The opportunity to present research results, participate in workshops or collect research data is crucial to biotechnology students' professional development. The CSUPERB Student Travel Grant Program supports CSU student travel to biotechnology-related professional meetings and workshops or to collect biotechnology-related data at shared instrumentation facilities or research sites.
