

Grant Program Title: Sustainable Transportation Planning Grants: Sustainable

Communities, Strategic Partnerships and Climate Adaptation Planning

Funding Agency: Caltrans
Award Amount: \$37.7 million

Brief Description:

The Sustainable Transportation Planning Grant Program was created to support the California Department of Transportation's (Caltrans) Mission: Provide a safe and reliable transportation network that serves all people and respects the environment Funding Category:

- The State-funded Sustainable Communities grants (\$29.5 million) are intended to support and implement Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Sustainable Communities Strategies/Alternative Planning Strategies (SCS/APS) (where applicable) and to ultimately achieve the State's greenhouse gas (GHG) target of 40 and 80 percent below 1990 levels by 2030 and 2050, respectively.
- The **State-funded Climate Adaptation Planning grants** (\$3 million) enacted with Senate Bill 198 (Committee on Budget and Fiscal Review, Chapter 71, Statutes of 2022), will support local and regional identification of transportation-related climate vulnerabilities through the development of climate adaptation plans, as well as project-level adaptation planning to identify adaptation projects and strategies for transportation infrastructure.
- The federal-funded Strategic Partnerships and Strategic Partnership Transit grants (\$4.5 million) support Federal Planning Factors and address State highway/transit issues of regional, interregional, and/or statewide significance, in partnership with Caltrans.
